BADGER STATE ETHANOL (BSE) is a dry-mill ethanol production facility located in Monroe.

The company was founded in 2000 by John Malchine and Gary Kramer with the goal of developing American agriculture. At the time of the founding, no one else had ever built an ethanol plant to this scale in Wisconsin which created some challenges for the developers.

Construction of the plant started in July 2001 and was completed in October 2002 with the plant starting up soon after. Today, BSE has a production capacity of over 95 million gallons of ethanol per year and is a major contributor to the local economy.

Since startup, BSE has paid over \$2.5 million in local property taxes, and put close to \$200 million back into the economy through investor distributions. BSE is also an active bidder at four county and WI State fair auctions and has purchased over 400 projects from youth in the last nine years. In addition, the company also gives back by supporting various organizations including State and local FFA chapters and many Monroe area businesses.
